Help Design the National Children's Week Poster!

The 2026 Children's Week theme will be 'Children have the right to use their own language, celebrate their culture, and practise their own religion'. This is based on Article 30 of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child.

Children across Australia are invited to participate in our poster competition reflecting the **2026 theme.** The winning artwork will be professionally adapted and reproduced for the 2026 national poster.

Entry Guidelines

Entries must be received by 21 November 2025.

Artwork must be the children's original work and not feature images featuring characters from TV or movies.

The artwork must reflect the theme.

Use bold, fun, strong colours, filling as much of the page as possible. You may use coloured markers, crayon, paint, pastels, collage. Do not use messy or bulky materials such as glitter, stickers or felt. Pencils aren't recommended.

Submissions must be A3 size (portrait) only on the supplied template. Keep all artwork inside the Outer Lines of the template.

Tips for Artwork

The theme can be visually interpreted in many ways. Go beyond illustrating an idea; consider telling a story, creating a character/s to visually describe the theme. The artwork doesn't have to be real; it can be imagined, or part of a dream.

Be creative with the use of colour. Grass doesn't have to be green, and the sky doesn't have to be blue. Rather than using all colours, choose a selection with variation in the shades or tones.

Consider the background. Where is the illustration set? Is it a forest or in space. Is a setting needed? A colour, shapes or pattern may help the main part of the image.

How to Submit Artwork

Entries are to be submitted via the childrensweek.org.au website.

A completed and signed Poster Competition Entry Form (available on the next page) must be completed and uploaded with the artwork online through the Children's Week website.
